Both are available to anyone in the congregation and the public. There are no income requirements. Fresh Express does not cost the Church anything. Food is donated by Pa. Food Bank. The Food Pantry is a minimal cost to the Church through the PA Food Bank, we also can use the extra food from the Fresh Express. The Food Pantry also gets donations from you, the Congregation.
